SANDWICH TODAY

- The town has 1,398 acres of land considered developable¹
- Sandwich has a working population of 10,804 people; 74.6% work in private industry, 16.1% work for a governmental entity and 16.1% are self-employed²
- The NRG Power Plant is the largest industrial contribution to the town's tax base³
- Average tax bill FY2021 was \$6,193.75⁴
- FY2021, total residential tax paid was \$57,268,361 and total commercial tax paid was \$9,465,831⁵

Frequently Asked Questions

- **Why should I attend these workshops?**
Your participation will help us frame and create a 10-year plan that will guide future decision-making in town.
- **What will be asked of me at the workshop?**
At the workshop you will be split into groups of 4-6 people. We will ask you a series of questions related to the workshop topic.
- **I noticed there are different workshops. Should I attend all of them?**
There are 5 topics, identified in a community visioning survey, that we are asking for input on. We are holding two workshops on each topic to gather maximum participation.
- **What will be done with the findings of the workshops?**
We will use the findings as a baseline to create action items that will guide decision making over the next 10-years.
